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HAWAA GWAII TRUST

SD50's food programs and student travel opportunities have benefitted immensely from our long-standing partnership with Gwaii Trust. Gwaii Trust provides a variety of grants to Haida Gwaii communities and organizations, and our students have benefitted from these grant opportunities. As expected of a large funding organization, our teachers/coaches had to be aware of grant timelines and application processes to access travel subsidy funds. As much as the funds were appreciated, there were times when a teacher was not aware of the opportunity or the deadline and so missed out on the funding. We also heard from teachers that it took time to get the applications ready and, in some cases, the same person was preparing applications several times a year.

Following an examination of historical funding levels to SD50 by **Carla Lutner**, Gwaii Trust's Chief Operations Officer, the **Board of Gwaii Trust** recently approved annual guaranteed funding to the school district of \$120 000 in 2023 to support student travel. This streamlined funding approach will allow students to benefit from travel



subsidies from Gwaii Trust without having sponsor teachers submit an application. Thank you to Carla and the Gwaii Trust Board for your forward thinking on supporting our students.

CONNECTING WITH COAST MOUNTAIN COLLEGE

I recently had the pleasure of connecting with **Dr. Laurie Waye**, President & CEO of Coast Mountain College, and **Heather Bastin**, Executive Director of External Relations, to discuss potential opportunities to partner that would increase opportunities for SD50 students. Many school districts across the province offer students dual credit programs, which was a key focus of our conversation. I appreciated Laure and Heather's time with me, and I look forward to sharing potential partnerships and learning opportunities that could be offered to SD50 students.

Westbrook, Katie Willmot, and Kieran Wake, and staff members Jaskwaan Bedard and Candace Weir travelled with GTN junior boys and girls basketball teams and a small group of Tahayghen students to Waglisa Bella Bella. In addition to playing basketball, our students participated in a two-day potlatch held by the family of Frank and

Kathy Brown of the house of $\lambda \dot{a} \lambda \dot{i} \gamma \dot{a} s \dot{i} a$ of the Haíłzaqv Nation. Our students were allowed to share Haida culture at 2:30 am on the second night of the potlatch, and it was shared repeatedly that our students represented our schools and community extremely well.

Our students played basketball and participated in the momentous cultural event with respect and attention, showcasing our commitment to basketball and cultural teachings



to our neighbouring Nation. A big haw'aa to coaches Cal, Katie, and Kieran, and to **Candace** and **Christian** of the Tluu Xaadaa Naay dance group, who included our students in the cultural sharing. We are grateful to our tremendous hosts who graciously supported this opportunity for our students.

LEARNING ABOUT TUNA



Gudangaay Tlaats'gaa Naay was very happy to host **Billy Yovanovich**, **Elizabeth Moore**, and **Tammi Ryland** on November 21 for an opportunity to learn about locally-caught tuna! Students learned how to cut and process tuna, and we are lucky to have a few cases of jars for our food program! Haw'aa.

PRACTICING HAIDA LANGUAGE

Agnes L. Mathers Elementary has been having weekly Xaayda Kil language lessons, which include drumming and singing with the students. Drumming and singing provide an excellent opportunity to discuss Haida protocols, learn songs, and find students' voices. The focus of

language learning is to normalize it in everyday interactions. Language topics include but are not limited to; *time of the year, numbers, colours, foods, basic greetings and feelings, what is happening in the student's lives, and most importantly, giving the students an entirely different language perspective.* In the intermediate classroom, students have to ask to go to the bathroom and get a drink of water in Xaayda Kil. It is photocopied and taped to every student's desk so they can practice until they have memorized it.

HAIDA GWAII WELCOMES NEW SD50 TEACHERS



Multigrade small schools, like Port Clements and **Agnes L. Mathers**, although small in size and sometimes challenging, also provide students with many opportunities to flourish. Leadership, mentorship, community contribution, individualized learning and strong

relationships are key strengths of the culture of these schools and are most often built into the day-to-day school culture. Hawaa to our educators at these small schools for helping create these school cultures of caring!

POST-SECONDARY TOURS

Thanks to travel subsidies from **Gwaii Trust**, secondary students from **Gudangaay Tlaats'gaa Naay** and **Gidgalang <u>K</u>uuyas Naay** will be visiting several post-secondary schools. The GKN Grade 12 class has recently completed their University Tour, which they would have normally done in grade 11 if not for the pandemic restrictions. Destinations on this year's tour included the <u>University of Victoria</u>, <u>Vancouver Island</u> <u>University</u>, and <u>Camosun College</u>. In addition to learning more about each of these schools, students also enjoyed some fun.

It takes a team to make trips like this happen, so a huge thank you to this year's chaperones, **Debi Laughlin, Colin Greenough,** and **Jenna Perry,** for their commitment and dedication to creating this opportunity for our students.

Gudangaay Tlaats'gaa Naay students depart for their post-secondary tour in January, so I look forward to sharing more about their trip in the February report.


BREAKFAST & LUNCH IN OUR SCHOOLS

I wanted to make you aware of a shift we are making due to increased cybersecurity threats becoming increasingly more sophisticated.

Multi-factor authentication (MFA)

With cybersecurity threats becoming increasingly sophisticated, School District No.50 Haida Gwaii is joining institutions around the world in adopting multi-factor authentication (MFA) as a way to keep our employees' and students' digital assets, information and user identities safe.

Key benefits include greater cybersecurity and a reduced risk of having your account accessed by someone other than yourself.

What is multi-factor authentication (MFA)?

- In a nutshell, MFA means using something besides a single username and password to access your account.
- In the coming weeks SD50 will require **Staff** to sign into your Microsoft 365, Google workspace, and Apple ID accounts using a two-step process. You will first sign in with your SD50 username and password, followed by a prompt for a second piece of authentication.
- **The first option** is to have a safe hardware ID token provided by the school district. This small piece of hardware generates codes that are synchronized with your account, providing you with the second factor of authentication.
- **The second option,** should you wish to use an alternative MFA method to sign into your Microsoft 365 accounts, is to choose to have SMS messages sent to your personal mobile phone, providing you with the second factor of authentication.

SafeID Hardware Token

If you choose to use the SafeID token, the device will be provided to you at no cost. Should the device, while in your care, be lost or damaged due to reckless care of the device, staff will incur a \$50 charge to have a new token issued.

• Please note that using your personal device is not required for MFA. If you do not want to use your personal device, choose the first option to received a school district provided ID token.
