Gudangaay Tlaats'gaa Naay strives to ensure that they offer elective courses that are interesting and engaging for students. **Chef Marjorie Fregin** has been teaching our Food Studies electives this year and has been sharing her incredible expertise with students of all grades. Under Marjorie's guidance, students help with a daily lunch at the school and learn solid fundamentals in the kitchen.

We are also very fortune to have **Ian McLean** teaching on a letter of permission in our wood shop this year. Ian is a joiner, cabinet maker and heritage carpenter by trade and is well known in Masset for exceptional work. Ian also has an extensive background in working with youth and has combined these two skills to make for some exceptional wood shop classes. Students take great care and precision in their projects and learn joinery and woodworking techniques to make beautiful objects out of local woods. Some of our grade 8's are finishing up their first small tables which are exquisitely constructed and aesthetically beautiful. We are lucky and thankful to have both Marjorie and Ian as part of the GTN staff team this year.

Tara Sjolund has been a support staff employee with SD50 since 2007 and has taken on various roles throughout the years. She has recently agreed to support our Xaad Kil program at Gudangaay Tlaats'gaa Naay while our teacher is on leave. Tara brings a strong vocabulary base and the ability use Xaad Kil and Xaayda Kil. She also carries a great deal of knowledge of Haida family trees, Clans and belonging, harvesting and processing, protocols and history.

Tahayghen Elementary welcomes the other remaining LOP teachers to SD50. **Nadja Smith-Hanson** is currently working on a Bachelor of Education, Yukon Native Teacher Education Program at Yukon University. We are excited to welcome her back to Haida Gwaii as part of the staff at Tahayghen starting Feb. 21st. Nadja spent some time on Haida Gwaii studying with the Haida Gwaii Institute where she learnt about ecology, ethnobotany, and community relations. She enjoys hiking, running, and spending time by the ocean in her spare time. These hobbies keep her fit and energized for the classroom, especially PE!

We also welcome former school trustee, **Adeana Young**, who has stepped into the part-time position of Haida Language and Culture teacher at Tahayghen Elementary. This assignment is in addition to her role as resource coordinator at the Xaad Kil Nee office in Old Massett. Adeana has successfully taught Xaad Kil before at Xaad Kil Nee in partnership with Simon Fraser University. Adeana also starred in the award winning 2018 film, <u>Edge of the Knife</u>.




