What is the DPAC?

The School Act gives parents and guardians the right, through **Parent Advisory Councils (or PACs)**, to provide feedback to the administrators of the schools that their children attend. Each school has the option to form a local PAC.

A District Parent Advisory Council (or DPAC), through its elected Executive and appointed Representatives, may advise the school board and Board of Trustees respecting any matter relating to the education of the students in the school district.

The Haida Gwaii DPAC has been established to serve as the officially recognized collective voice of parents and guardians within School District No. 50, here on Haida Gwaii.

Who are we?

DPAC Representatives are appointed by the Parent (Guardian) Advisory Councils from each of the schools within SD50 on Haida Gwaii. Where local school PACs do not currently exist, representation can still be made by a parent or guardian with interest in their child's education.
