I am pleased to share that we have developed a new Administrative Procedure intended to outline our intentions, and the related procedures, for our district to apply for a Human Rights exemption through a Special Program application process. The intention of our employment equity plan is to prioritize qualified people of Indigenous ancestry for employment in our district, over other qualified applicants, until the number of staff identifying in this way matches or exceeds our representative student population. Student Well Being

Thank you to district Communication Skills Specialist Teachers, Jacqui Ferraby and Marci Malloy, District Principal, Leighann Rodger for creating a plan to ensure we complete the newly required Kindergarten Literacy Screener. Also thank you to all of the Kindergarten teachers for learning and applying this assessment to all of our Kindergarten classrooms and students. All of these staff gathered and met early in November for review of the data collected and to collaborate forward using that information. Very powerful action from our team. The next Kindergarten assessment takes place in February.

Thank you to Northern Health for partnering with us to provide ASIST (Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training) at the October 24/25, 2025 Professional Development Day. Also thank you to the staff from Haida Child and Families, Skidegate Health Center, SD50 staff and 6 students for attending this important learning.

Embracing Unique Culture and Territory

District Principal, Joanne Yovanovich and Deputy Superintendent, Manu Madhok hosted the second part of the professional learning series session with Dr Sara Davidson and Dr Cynthia Nicol. The focus is on enriching our Learning with Stories, Land, and Language from Haida Gwaii! This is being offered as a Four-Part Learning Series that staff may attend as a series in full or in part.

Several district staff are participating in a four part series offered by Monique Gray-Smith called *The Medicine of Stories*. Monique will host each session and invite a story teller to help her guide the exploration of how stories help us learn, nourish our spirits, strengthen communities and inspire change.

Working Together

The Port Clements Elementary School PAC parent and community input survey was closed and collated. Superintendent, Lisa Bernoties and the PAC and vice principal, Nadine Whittle, reviewed the results from the survey. Lisa and District Principal, Leighann Rodger joined the PCE PAC on Thursday, October 9th to begin co-authoring the focus for a new School Learning Planning. Lisa met with the staff on Thursday, October 30, 2025 to share this input toward the further development of a new School Learning Plan. The PAC has now finalized a three page overview to describe the school learning plan's intended direction. There is a new survey being distributed soon, with the PACs new school learning plan, to all parents across Haida Gwaii school district. This survey will ask parents if this new plan inspires them enough to have their child attend PCE and/or remain at PCE for the intermediate years. I will bring these results back to the Board with options for consideration at the February, 2026 Board Meeting.
